Local Attractions

SCULPTURES SYMPOSIUM

Viewing fabulous sculptures in the desert as the sun sets across a majestic backdrop is far from an everyday experience but a visit to the Broken Hill Sculpture and Living Desert Sanctuary makes it possible. Located in the Barrier Ranges about 10 minutes from Broken Hill, 12 sandstone sculptures from worldwide artists adorn the landscape. The 2400 hectare reserve in Broken Hill is the perfect spot to soak up the magnificent scenery. The reserve is also home to a flora and fauna sanctuary and offers several walking trails.

MINERS MEMORIAL

The legacy is written large on the Miners' Memorial. Its striking contemporary architecture and view over the city add emotional weight to the list of more than 800 miners who lost their lives on the job. The dump truck (two small trucks) nearby adds further weight as a memorial to the only two miners still entombed. Take a moment to read the poem inscribed on it.

The dump trucks and the Miners' Memorial are sober reminders of why Broken Hill pioneered a culture of trade unionism, including the introduction of the 35 hour working week and the defeat of conscription.

ROYAL FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE (RFDS) VISITOR CENTRE

The RFDS Bruce Langford Visitor Centre combines a museum, theatre and shop, with interactive displays showing the history of the RFDS and tributes to the doctors, pilots and flight nurses and the many community groups and benefactors who support them.

Visit and tour the working RFDS base, view the aircraft in the hangar and watch a unique film in the 44 seat theatre. Shop for special souvenirs and explore the Mantle of Safety Museum.



ART GALLERIES

The Broken Hill Regional Art Gallery is the oldest regional art gallery in New South Wales. Even the historic building (Sully's Emporium) in which the gallery is housed has won numerous heritage awards for restoration and refurbishment.

Wyman Street's Pro Hart Gallery is home to a broad selection of Pro Hart paintings as well as hundreds of works from other well-known Australian artists such as Sir William Dobell, Arthur Boyd and Albert Tucker. The gallery was designed by Hart artist himself and in true artistic fashion the art has been arranged in an unconventional manner around the gallery.

OUTBACK ASTRONOMY

You probably won't find Cate, Nicole or Kylie out this way often (well, at least not unless they're filming the next great 'Hollywood' flick) but you can certainly "hang out with the stars" at Outback Astronomy. Far away from the city lights, the sky viewing out here is superb, and with both naked eye and telescope sky shows, you'll learn so much about the beauty of the universe - perfect for budding astronomers and casual star-gazers alike.

SULPHIDE STREET RAILWAY & HISTORICAL MUSEUM COMPLEX

This former station building was built in 1905, and houses the original Silverton Tramway Company locomotives & memorabilia. You'll also find the Broken Hill Migrant Heritage Museum, Hospital Museum, Ron Carter Transport Pavilion and the Tess Alfonsi Mineral Collection in the complex. Well worth a visit

BROKEN HILL HERITAGE WALK TOUR

Take a trip through history with a 2-hour volunteer guided tour, as you traverse Broken Hill CBD and learn all about Australia's First Heritage Listed City. This tour is a great way to experience Broken Hill through the eyes of its locals, with insightful and passionate guides. Tours depart from the Visitor Information Centre, Monday - Friday at 10am, except during summer months.

SILVERTON

This fascinating little almost-ghost town 25kms north-west of Broken Hill with a population of only 40 people is a slice of Australia's history, once being home to over 3000 people during its heady gold rush years. The heritage buildings that may look familiar, as they have been the setting for many well-known films, shows and commercials! Check out the heritage walking trail, visit the very interesting museum, enjoy a beer in the Silverton Hotel. Finally, top off your experience with a camel ride from Silverton Camel Treks: from 15-minute saunters to overnight Outback excursions.

History

HISTORY OF MOUNT GIPPS HOTEL

From the late 1800s onwards, for almost a century, the Mt Gipps Hotel brought together fascinating adventurers from far and wide who yarned stories of their Outback travels with one another. With a cold drink in hand and red dust on their boots, the hotel hosted many a visitor, from explorers to soldiers to miners and artists.

The Mt Gipps Hotel closed in 1987, remaining silent for three decades. But as of 2018, this historic venue is once again the lively home of travellers and storytellers, with the brand-new refurbished Broken Hill Outback Resort bringing today's amenities to the rugged Outback so beloved for generations untold. After years of neglect, this heritage building has been restored to its former glory, and is the centerpiece of the new resort.
